 - ✓ We need to arrange a regular rental of a trailer (small U-haul) or a small truck (14 ft box truck) at a discounted rate each month for Angel Food pick-up and delivery.
 - ✓ We need to find boxes to use each month. We will require each person to bring a box, laundry basket or such for exchange but we will need some boxes to get us started. We probably need to start with 20-30 medium size boxes.
 - ✓ We are still looking for a volunteer to take special orders once a month on a Wednesday evening at the church. We will be advertising set hours for placing orders in person for people who are not able to place orders online, or who are using food stamps.
