- **Thursday, May 6th, starting at 7:30 pm at St. John's: JP Concerts presents the New England Spiritual Ensemble.** Donations gratefully accepted, to help support the musicians. "Songs that soothe the soul" describes the traditional African American spiritual, which forms the New England Spiritual Ensemble's repertoire and frames its mission. Gospel which evolved from the traditional spirituals, can be more exuberant, but nothing touches the depths of the soul or connects with its yearnings more than the spirituals. Although not all of us learned them at the knee of a grandmother, the spirituals are part of the cultural experience of all of us – a uniquely American musical tradition born of suffering but infused with unshakable hope. The Boston-based New England Spiritual Ensemble was founded in 1994 by Vincent Dion Stringer, Myran Parker-Brass and Beverly Mosby. The members of the ensemble are conservatory trained professional musicians who are exceptional communicators – their performances are captivating and totally engrossing, always involving the audience emotionally. Modeled after the world-renowned Fisk Jubilee Singers, the ensemble is devoted to "preserving the art and tradition of Negro spirituals". As such, members have created several educational outreach programs over the years, including a summer music camp for high school students, a Spirituals symposium that aired online at WGBH, and a joint workshop with the Cantata Singers at Boston Arts Academy's Summer Institute for educators. In addition to national and international tours, the New England Spiritual Ensemble has appeared nationally on "CBS Sunday Morning", on National Public Radio's "Performance Today", and is the subject of several public television features. The ensemble's recording, "Comin Up Shouting", features the arrangements of spirituals and works of John Andrew Ross. According to the Boston Globe, the New England Spiritual Ensemble is "excellent...blessed with performers who own good voices...daringly expressive", and reported that their performance "brought a hush to the hall". - **BEHOLD: Her Story of Easter by Jim Grant with the Magdalene Ensemble (Cello, Soprano, Mezzo, Organ/Piano) on Thursday, May 13, 2010 at 7:30 pm at St. John's Episcopal Church.** Tickets at the door only: General Admission: \$20 Seniors and Students \$15. "Behold" is a musical mystery play that celebrates the awakening of resurrection consciousness in our lives. Unlike the traditional narrative accounts of Easter, the story is seen through the eyes of the women who were there, and told through their words. The composer James Mathews Grant wanted to create a more emotionally intimate oratorio form, without the large orchestra, and chorus. Like a three panel medieval altarpiece, the result is an ensemble piece in three movements for vocalists, cello, piano and organ, performed by an all female cast. The eclectic musical style ranges from the traditional Jewish Sabbath song, Catholic Gregorian Chant, and the soaring organ style of a Protestant Easter hymn. This form of spiritual drama has its roots in the ancient Greek mystery schools, and the mystical Christian teaching of the beatific vision, which signifies the transformative power of witnessing the risen Jesus. Those who experienced this vision were said to have been transported into a state of eternal beatitude. The purpose of "Behold" is to give the audience an aesthetic experience of this beatific effect, through music and ritual theater. The Magdalene Ensemble (Rachael Chagat, Soprano, Janine Hawley, Mezzo-Soprano, Elizabeth Latifa Noor Anderson, cello, Barbara McKenzie, organ and piano, Jim Grant Director and Composer and Iris Anne Grant, Set Designer and Graphics) was formed in 2007 as a collaborative creative ensemble of composers, musicians and artists who have specialized in creating sacred musical drama.
